Consensus Statement from the American Association of Directors of Psychiatric Residency Training (AADPRT) and the Association of Directors of Medical Student Education in Psychiatry (ADMSEP) on the 2021-22 Residency and Fellowship Application Cycle

- Per AADPRT and ADMSEP
 - All interviews shall be virtual
 - Attendance at second-look events not mandatory or encouraged, per se, and should not be taken into consideration when rating and ranking applicants
 - No swag permitted. Gift cards for food also prohibited
 - All programs nationwide are expected to comply
- Institutional/GME decision about second looks, not a program specific decision.
 - Will depend on COVID case rates and other safety factors

Curriculum

PGY1

4 months medicine (inpt, outpt, ED), 2 months neuro, 5 months inpatient psychiatry (VA and DHMC), 2 wks emergency psychiatry, 2 wks inpatient geri psych NHH

• PGY2

- 4 months inpatient psychiatry (VA, NHH), 4 months CL, 6 wks residential substance abuse, 6 wks whole health
- Longitudinal outpatient and psychotherapy
- 6 weeks jeopardy

PGY3

- 12 months outpatient (general, refractory mood disorder, ECT, TMS, child, geriatrics, community, psychotherapy)
- Modified schedule for research track, or residents seeking extra research time

PGY4

- Mostly elective
- Junior attending experience
- Teaching Roles



Call Schedule

PGY1

- Evening call (6-10pm) at DH approx. weekly for 6 months of the year
- 6 Saturday 24 hour calls per year at DH
- 6 Sunday daytime calls per year at DH

PGY2

- 4 weeks of Night Float (in 2 week blocks) plus 9 overnight calls per year at DH
- 6 Sunday Supervisory daytime calls with the PGY1 intern per year at DH
- 6 overnight calls at New Hampshire Hospital per year
- 4 weeks of home call night float (in 2 week blocks) plus 7 home calls per year at the VA

PGY3

- 6 Friday overnight calls per year at DH
- 2 weeknight and 6 weekend home call per year at the VA

PGY4

- 7 Supervisory Saturday calls with the PGY1 intern per year at DH
 - May be slightly more or less depending on size of the PGY4 class

DH = Dartmouth-Hitchcock Medical Center

VA = White River Junction VA Medical Center

Child and Adolescent Track

- Automatic transition to CAP fellowship after PGY-3 year (no more ERAS!)
- Pediatric rotations in PGY-1 year
- Pediatric neurology rotation in PGY-1 year
- Earlier start of CAP experiences
- ***separate NRMP match number






Research Track

- 1 resident per year
- Protected research time all four years
 - PGY-1 year: 4 weeks
 - PGY-2 year: ½ day/wk plus 6 week elective
 - PGY-3 year : 25%-50 % of time
 - PGY-4 year: 50%-75% of time
- ***separate NRMP match number
- Goal of mentored transition to NIMH funding mechanisms
- Eligible for NIH Loan Repayment program





Didactics

- Protected time Tuesday mornings without clinical responsibilities all 4 years
 - Grand Rounds
 - Resident meeting
 - Didactics
- Class specific didactics, in parallel with clinical stage of training
- Protected time Thursday mornings PGY3 year
 - Child didactics with child fellows
- Additional case conferences, rotation didactics, clinic didactics
- Journal Clubs
- Research Skills Series
- Twice Annual Resident Retreat includes educational session on resident chosen topic
- Specialty-specific educational offerings

DH Fellowships and Residencies

- Addiction Psychiatry Fellowship
- Child and Adolescent Psychiatry Fellowship

- Leadership Preventive Medicine Residency Program (LPMR)
 - Participants earn a master's degree in public health, in a program that focuses on policy issues, outcome measures, and quality improvement related to psychiatry.

- Residents who choose to do fellowships outside Dartmouth frequently get their top choice
 - Recent matches include UCSF child psych, MGH Consult psych, MGH Child Psych, MGH Community Psych, Ohio State Consult Psych, Brown Child Psych

- VA Quality Scholars Program (VAQS)
 - year long fellowship program has also been utilized by psychiatry residents to gain experience in outcomes research and quality improvement for health care systems.
- Dartmouth Center for Healthcare Delivery Science
 - The Master of Health Care Delivery Science (MHCDS) at Dartmouth College offers physician and executive leaders skills and knowledge needed to design and lead crucial transformations within their organizations and across the health care industry.
- The Dartmouth Institute for Health Policy and Clinical Practice (TDI)
 - In addition to formal programs that may be pursued through TDI, psychiatry residents may take select courses, free of charge, on a variety of topics (e.g. Research Methodology, Microsystems).
- SYNERGY Center
 - The SYNERGY Center allows for a variety of research resources to be organized in one center, providing for training and resources that residents may access to support career development in psychiatric research.

Resident Benefits

Recent resident salary increase, with expectations for future salary increases Residents are eligible for a comprehensive set of benefits:

- Eligible for one D-H medical plan the \$0 Deductible PPO plan which is a richer plan than those offered to staff and providers
 - Employee contributions toward this medical plan are not based on salary they are set at the lowest salary bracket (i.e. under \$50k) regardless of the resident's actual salary
- Short Term Disability coverage equal to 100% of base salary for up to 90 days at no cost to the resident
- Long Term disability equal to 80% of base salary to a maximum benefit of \$3,750 per month at no cost to the resident
- Basic Life and AD&D coverage equal to 1x annual salary up to \$100k at no cost to the resident
 - Opportunity to purchase additional coverage for themselves and their dependents
- Retirement / 403(b) Plan with employer match of 50% on up to 4% of employee pay saved
- Dental
- Vision
- Health Care and Dependent Care Reimbursement Accounts
- Identity Theft Protection
- Pet Insurance



Resident Wellness

- PGY2 and PGY3 process groups
- Buddy system for incoming PGY1s
- Mentorship available with faculty
- Protected time in PGY1 year for self-care, doctor appointments, etc.
- Self-care, therapy, etc, encouraged
- List of sliding scale therapists and therapists who take DH insurance
- Designated Wellbeing Psychologist for residents
- Supportive chief residents, faculty and leadership
- Culture that welcomes feedback and responds to suggestions
 - recent examples include changing to night float system based on resident preference, adding second attending to weekend call coverage to reduce resident workload
- Work life balance encouraged






